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COLLEGE STUDENTS HOLD KEY TO NEEDED CHANGES IN LEADERSHIP ETHICS

LeaderShape Volunteer Sees Changing Attitudes

CHAMPAIGN, IL, FEBRUARY 1, 2010 – The word "ethics" is generating a lot of news these days, and for all the wrong reasons. From sports to show business, politics to the financial sector, there appears to be a crisis of ethics, a leadership deficit.

Are we becoming less ethical as a nation? Have we lost our moral compass? Or, has our obsession with the 24-hour news cycle simply highlighted the behavior of a few "bad apples?"

Rob Sheehan, Chairperson of the Board of Trustees for LeaderShape, says we should look to today's college students, the next generation of leaders, for the answer, and he believes we will be pleasantly surprised.

"What we see in our college campus-based sessions is very encouraging," Sheehan reports. "Young adults, preparing to enter the 'real world,' are heading out with a personal vision, a belief that they can take the seemingly impossibly, and the will to achieve their goals without compromising their integrity."

Headquartered in Champaign, Illinois, LeaderShape takes its week-long leadership training and personal development program to more than 60 college campuses annually. In its 24-year history, the non-profit organization that has graduated more than 35,000 college students, teaching them effective leadership skills through a healthy disregard for the impossible, tempered by the highest ethical standards.

"What we're seeing at LeaderShape sessions is a genuine understanding that core values, thoughtful decisions and courage all play critical roles in ethical decision making today," Sheehan says.

Through an intensive six-day program, LeaderShape students are immersed in an environment where they are encouraged and challenged to practice new skills, give and receive feedback from peers and faculty, and try new behaviors in an open, supportive atmosphere.

One of the best known LeaderShape graduates is Larry Page, co-founder of Google, who recalled his LeaderShape experience in a 2009 commencement address, saying, "When I was here at the University of Michigan, I had actually been taught how to make dreams real! Although Page may be the most well-known LeaderShape graduate, and Sheehan is thrilled and thankful for his endorsement, he says countless graduates have taken their training and the values of the organization to work in every walk of life. "Whether they go on to careers in public service, or in the private sector, they report back that through LeaderShape, they discovered a personal passion, revealed a hidden talent or skill, and ultimately set a course toward an ambitious goal."

Sheehan is encouraged by what he sees as a change in attitudes on today's college campus. "Although negative stories are all over the headlines—moral failings, lack of leadership, unethical short cuts—the students we encounter through LeaderShape are taking a much different path—they WANT to take a different path—as they work to become tomorrow's leaders," Sheehan said.
